We invite academics and practice-based researchers to propose papers on this theme or presentations of practice-based research.

Keynote speaker Prof. Didier Plassard, Université Paul Valéry – Montpellier, France.

One grant of 500€ is made available by the UNIMA Research Commission to assist participation in this event for young or early-career researchers (including those focused on practice-based research). Please note in your proposal if you wish to apply for the grant.

Themes to consider include (but are not limited to):

- § the uses and effectiveness of multimedia in puppet theatre
 performance;
- § the relationship (conceptual or scenic) between multimedia and puppetry in performance;
- § questions of performance and of performing alongside or with multimedia within puppetry and object theatre;
- § the effects and limits of multimedia within puppetry and object theatre;
- § new understandings of puppetry and object theatre terminologies and definitions due to the inclusion and exploration of multimedia in the 21st century.

Selected papers will be published as part of the proceedings of this symposium.
